

Whittier Narrows Park Field Boundaries & Rules of The Greater Los Angeles Softball Association

1. Field Boundaries

Foul Territory

Foul Territory is the part of the playing field outside the first and third base lines extended to the back of the dugout fence and its imaginary extension outward to the outfield and its imaginary extension perpendicularly upwards. Outside of this area is considered a dead ball or out-of-play area.

2. Field Rules

- A. Any ball hitting a tree, light pole, bush, wall or fence on a fly in fair territory will be considered an out-of-the-park home run. Hitting any of these on the ground in fair territory will be live and playable (except that a ball rolling into the bushes on field 1 will be a three-base award and the ball is dead)
- B. Three-Base Award: The ball is dead. The batter, without liability to be put out, is awarded three (3) bases at the time the ball was pitched. Any runners, on base at the time the ball was pitched, score.
